AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATIVE PROGRAMS

BACHELOR OF ARTS (SOCIAL WORK)

WHEREAS, the Social of Behavioral Sciences Division at Northwest Iowa Community College, hereinafter referred to as NCC, wishes to provide for certain of its students to receive instruction that will provide an Associate of Arts Degree (AA) and a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Work, and

WHEREAS, the Social Work Major at Northwestern College, hereafter referred to as NWC, have the instructors, expertise, and the accredited programs that lead to a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Work, and

WHEREAS, the parties for mutual consideration and benefits agree to offer educational services in order to provide students to access and complete a cooperative educational program for the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Work, the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

A. General Terms.

- 1. The purpose of this Agreement is to assist specified students to prepare for a career in Social Work by receiving instruction that utilizes the expertise of NCC and NWC in providing the educational preparation for these careers.
- 2. The parties jointly agree to:
 - a. provide for the joint administration of the programs.
 - b. coordinate the programs as a joint responsibility of the Division Chairs at NCC and the Department Chairs at NWC.

3. NWC agrees to:

- a. provide academic counseling to students to intend to apply for admission to the Social Work program.
- b. admit qualified students to the Social Work major.
- c. confer Bachelor of Arts degrees when all the requirements for the degree have been met.

4. NCC agrees to:

- a. provide academic counseling to students to students who intend to apply for admission to the cooperative programs.
- b. admit students to the college and the Associate of Arts programs.
- c. confer the Associate of Arts degree when the requirements for the degree have been met.

B. Duration

The duration of this agreement shall continue through August 15th of each academic year. Either party may choose by September 1 to terminate this agreement for the next academic year. Should the agreement be terminated all students enrolled in the cooperative programs shall be graduated. New students will no longer be admitted.
